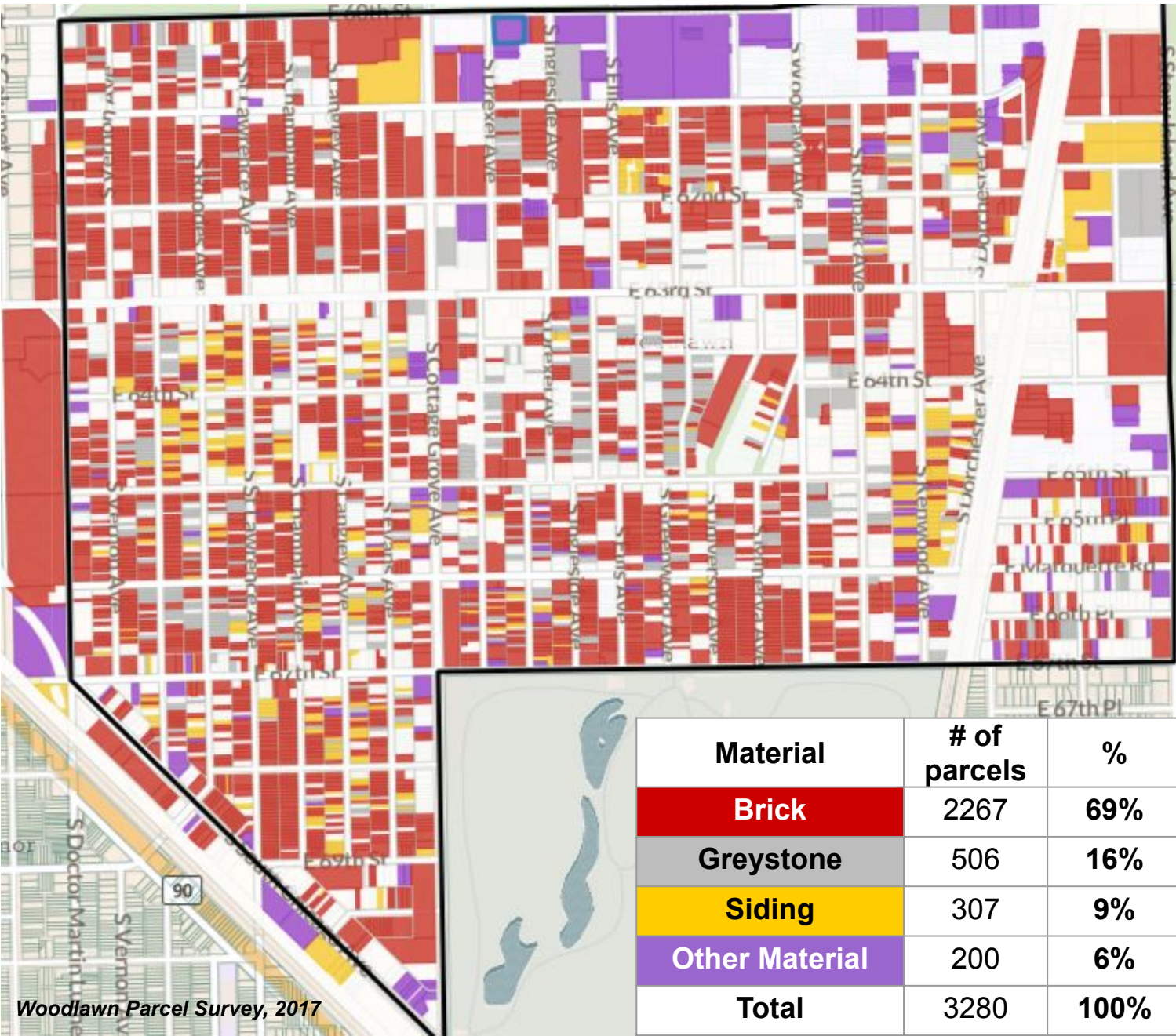


Question 3: Identify the material the building is constructed out of.



Overwhelmingly, buildings in Woodlawn are made from brick - the near 70% figure reflects the numerous 2-6 unit residential structures, or Chicago-style 2-Flats, typically made out of red brick. Woodlawn is also home to over 500 Chicago-style Greystones in 2-, 3-, and 4-flats, as well as single family homes. WPS was specific to tag greystone structures as the high-quality material is considered an asset and programs to remediate greystone properties have been implemented in other Chicago neighborhoods.

Much of Woodlawn was built in the late 1800s and early 1900s with long lasting materials like those described above. The limestone used to construct Chicago's greystones was imported from Indiana and would be prohibitively expensive to build with today. Using GIS, students calculated over 800 properties in Woodlawn built in the 1800s.

The use of siding appears mostly on single family homes and can be found frequently west of Cottage Grove. These homes tend to be built more recently than their stone counterparts.
